He specializes in professional restorative services on antique, classic and exotic automobiles. This includes custom metal shaping/panel beating services from a repair panel to a complete body. Covered in his demonstration will be a brief discussion of the methods and theory of metal shaping (panel beating) including hand tools and their use as well as power tools and safety.
