

Simsbury Summit 2024 - May 20th to 24th in Simsbury, CT

Come join the Austin Healey Club of New England at historic Simsbury, CT the third week of May for "Simsbury Summit 24" at our host hotel the Simsbury Inn.

An award-winning town, Simsbury is listed on the National Trust for Historic Preservation as one of its "Dozen Distinctive Destinations." Also, federally designated as a "Preserve



America" community, the town features a charming downtown filled with historic homes and fine restaurants, while the farms and open space harken back to their agricultural roots. Simsbury lies in the northern end of the Farmington Valley. The east side of Simsbury, going toward the Capital city of Hartford, is flanked by Talcott Mountain, part of the Metacomet Ridge. This mountainous trap rock ridgeline stretches from Long Island Sound to nearly the Vermont border. Notable features of the Metacomet Ridge in Simsbury include Heublein Tower, Talcott Mountain State Park, Penwood State Park, and the Tariffville Gorge of the Farmington River.

in Lakeville, Connecticut, a hamlet in the town of Salisbury, in the state's northwest corner. Built in 1956, it is the nation's third oldest continuously operating road racing course.

For those who would like to test their driving skills in their classic Healey, you may enjoy Track Tapas, which is a two-hour educational experience behind the wheel of your own Healey on both the FCP Euro Proving Grounds and the 1.5-mile road course. Suitable for beginner-or intermediate-level track drivers, all sessions include expert coaching from our pros. More

If you prefer to watch, Lime Rock provides stunning views of the track and during the lunch break, we will be offered Healey only parade laps of the track.

Modern Day Monet - THE 1st ANNUAL JURIED EXHIBITION







They are the top of the list for AHCA club and play a leadership role in club policy and national events. It all started with them. Glad to have and see their direction for us all.


They do very little in the way of supporting local clubs and all we get is a magazine for our AHCA dues.

Multiple Choice






The average age of our members is 71 years old, ranging from 19 to well over 81 years old.




Our second largest category of membership is 2 years or less, with an excellent average of 11 years in total.

General Healey Maintenance - these sessions are full of great information - even on things I never thought of!


Replacement parts upgrades regardless of concours. What makes the car less of a problem?


I just need to get familiar with the content and access to the site.

84% of our members who answered the survey Healeys are registered and road worthy. Many of our owners feel comfortable driving their cars hundreds of miles per day and on average 153 miles any day. The next graph details the answers and of how many miles they are comfortable to drive a day. Twenty five members are comfortable driving their cars 200 miles per day or more. The largest group (14) answered 100 miles per day. This is a great indication of the reliability of many owners of Healeys.

The people. The car is the magnet and the friendships the bond.



It is easy to recommend, Hard to make happen. I wish I had the energy to focus on the one club, I belong to several as I have several English car.


Like the idea of the wings to allow more local/regional closer to home activities

St. Jude's Childrens Hospital



In fact, AHCNE welcomes many members who live outside the six New England states. In order to facilitate in-person meetings and gatherings AHCNE has been divided into seven geographic areas or Wings. This division was initially established using USPS area Zip Codes, but was not intended to create boundaries. ALL Wing activities are open to ALL AHCNE members. For organization and administrative purposes, a volunteer Wing Coordinator position was established for each Wing. The Wing Coordinator is not an activities director, but rather a facilitator and information resource for new and old members. Subject to annual appropriation, a small budget is available to the Wing Coordinator to facilitate gatherings and can be used for reimbursement of certain Wing expenses. The following is not a formal job description, but rather a list of activities where Wing Coordinators can be most helpful to the club:

- Welcome new Members and introduce them to club website and resources.
- Assist members in planning and advertising Wing tours.
- Facilitate member networking.
- Promote two-way communications with club Board of Directors.
- Identify and recruit members to assume leadership roles within AHCNE.
- Encourage members to organize periodic breakfast or dinner gatherings and bring guests.
- Remind members to promote AHCNE at local car events.
