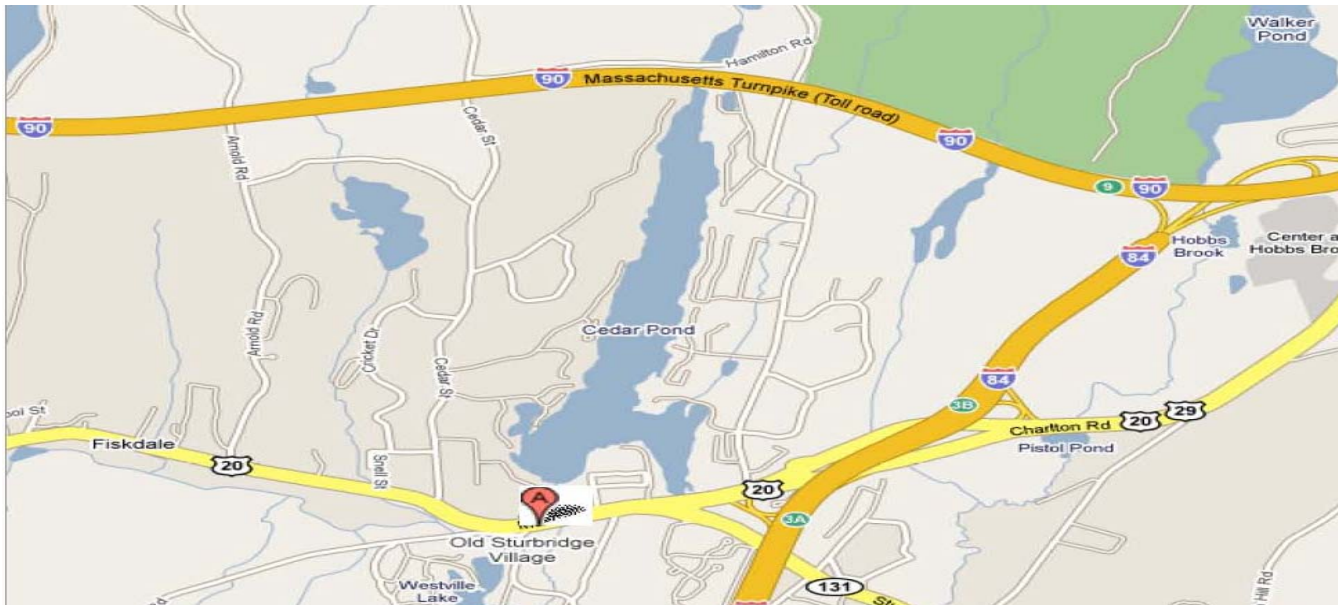

Jon is a self proclaimed professional "Tin Knocker" and started doing business in 1985 as Sports Car Specialties. He specializes in professional restorative services on antique, classic and exotic automobiles. This includes custom metal shaping/panel beating services from a repair panel to a complete body. He also does fixture built/straightened chassis and panel work. Be sure to check out his web site at www.sportscarspecialties.com

Covered in his demonstration will be a brief discussion of the methods and theory of metal shaping (panel beating) including hand tools and their use as well as power tools and safety. He will also touch upon welding processes including joint configuration and hammering seams. These demonstrations will be explained as Jon completes repairs to an Austin Healey fender.
