

I think most members are knowledgeable and avid watchers of Chasing Classic Cars on Velocity and were excited to see the Moal Speedster which was featured on last year's episodes, is a one-off design on the 32 Ford Chassis with a Flathead engine and a 5 speed gearbox and a beautiful aluminum body.

Wayne invited us into the showroom with roughly a dozen stunning classics including a Mercedes 300 Gullwing and 190 Roadster along with a 30's Bentley, spectacular 356 Porsche convertible, newer Ferrari, and a Shelby Mustang. Wayne shared the story how he followed in his father's footsteps in classic car industry. Wayne's Dad specialized on restoring Model A's and started their national club. F40 Motorsports has 12 employees and most have been with Wayne 25 to 30 years.

Wayne graciously answered all the questions from our curious members except how many cars are in his personal collection.

Wayne regularly consigns several cars at the major classic car auctions around the country. He finds certain cars will sell well at specific auctions and others are better to sell through his own operation. F40 Motorsports will sell muscle cars but classic cars are more of a specialty. After more than half an hour telling us stories in the showroom we moved to one of the restoration shops in the same building. We were afforded complete access to the restoration shop to see the incredible craftsmanship.

There were some beautifully restored cars waiting delivery, including the yellow 1949 Buick Roadmaster convertible from the movie, Rain Man from 1988 with Tom Cruise and Dustin Hoffman. There have been 150 episodes of Chasing Classics Cars over the past 10 years, all without a script, and Wayne finds all the cars himself and has just signed another two contract extension for the award winning show.



## Castle in the Clouds Antique and Classic Automobile Event



#### From our Guest Technical Advisor Jim Begin :

How to restore that great sound to your muffler

If there is a particular subject that you would like to see covered in this section, please let us know.

#### How to restore that great Healey sound to your muffler....

Here is a little modification I did that worked for me after many attempts to tone down the exhaust on my Healey. One new stock mild steel muffler was so loud, that after a short test run I removed it and put the old one back on. Some of the club members would know why, but now I have a polished STAINLESS STEEL exhaust by Tourist Trophy. Had to have it, but I didn't like the sharp sound it made. I had someone ( unnamed ) say they heard a hint of Harley Davison when I started up.

Here's what I did that brought back that nice sports car sound. At the rear of the muffler centering between the two tail pipes and the outer welded body flange I drilled a 1" hole (I would now recommend a smaller hole 7/8" or 3/4" would work better) making sure to leave enough material around the edge of the hole to make a seal. Use #4 steel wool rolled up to pack the muffler. Put in 3 or 4 pads and try it, to find the right sound that you like. The plug for the hole is made with fender washers and a strong back detailed in the picture. I love the sound the Healey now has. It's that old glass pack report when coming up though the gears and at cruise, it's perfect.
