Rallye Master Ken has persuaded Barbie to take out her Barbie Healey and find some of Cape Ann's most stunning views, scenic roads and high-dollar homes to amaze you on the Cape Ann Rallye and Brewery Tour. (OK, it was really Rick Neville and Larry Swift, we'll leave it up to you who was Ken and who was Barbie.)

Coming a week after Summit, it will be a perfect counterpoint to the mountains of Vermont and will give Healey folks in the greater Boston area an enjoyable one-day outing if they can't make the trip to Summit. It will be a great day for big Healeys and Sprites alike as we wind through seacoast roads and country lanes. If your Healey is still under restoration, bring a BJ9, all vehicles are welcome.

We'll meet at the Beverly, Massachusetts Service Plaza on Rte. 128 Northbound (Just past Exit 19) starting at 9:00 and we'll start sending cars out as soon as you register and get your route instructions. The Plaza has Shell fuel facilities, rest rooms, convenience store, a Burger King and Dunkin' Donuts to fortify oneself for the day's activities. The Rallye will cover approximately 50 miles and take 4 hours to complete. Built into that time is an hour for rallyists to pick one of the many sights along the way and have a look around and perhaps take a tour. If you think you'll want to stop at one of the local attractions, get there closer to 9:00 a.m. and you'll have plenty of time to make a sightseeing stop or two. If you just want to run the rallye and meet for lunch and the brewery tour, we'll stay until 10:30 to send you out.



For those who've never been on a rallye before, *don't worry about it*. This is designed to be a guided tour with easy to follow directions and to satisfy those with a competitive vent, some fun questions to answer along the way. Nothing tricky. You should be able to answer all the clues while driving along taking in the North Shore. No looking back over your shoulder, no stopping to get out of the car to read a tiny sign, or requiring an advanced degree in English literature to figure out the clues. Much of our route (except when we take you to the "secret" parts) will follow the Essex Coastal Scenic Byway and if you decide to make a weekend of it, this link will lead you to places to stay as well as a good overview of the area:

Our first stop will be Hammond Castle: http://www.hammondcastle.org/ . This medieval—style mansion built between 1926-9 by John Hays Hammond, Jr., a prolific inventor, offers breathtaking ocean views and fascinating self-guided tours. Well worth a look.

As we travel north to Gloucester, the rallye route will take you through Boston's "Gold Coast", where Boston Brahmins escaped the summer heat of the city. You'll pass through locations with outstanding Atlantic views that most North Shore tourists never get to see unless they've got a local

guide or know a gardener to the Cabots and the Lodges.

Gloucester is a working port and for fans of Discovery Channel's tuna fishing show, "Wicked Tuna", home of the Bluefin fleet. We'll pass by some great harbor views and if you're interested the local merchants will be holding their Sidewalk Bazar, if that's where you'd like to spend your fre:

From Rockport, we travel through Annisquam, with some wonderful ocean views as well as the granite quarries that supplied so many public buildings and monuments throughout New England. From there, we'll head to Essex, home of New England wooden boat building history and the magic of succulent fried clams. Take a tour of the Essex Shipbuilding Museum and see how these masters of the sea were built: http://www.essexshipbuildingmuseum.org/

From there, we'll head along "Clam Alley" to "Clam Town", Ipswich, MA. You'll need to veer off the rallye route a bit, to get to Crane Beach and the Crane Estate. The beach is gorgeous, but parking will be \$30 if you'd like o look around or spend some time hanging out:



Visit to the Austin Healey Museum In Holland By Neal Grotenhuis

When I planned a recent business trip to Eindhoven in the Netherlands for meetings Thursday and Friday, I discovered the airfares for a Saturday return were far more expensive than a Sunday return. I would be alone, on a Saturday with all day to kill. I thought of all the things I would miss doing because of this over-the-weekend travel, e.g. projects, checking off things on my honey-do list, maybe rewarded by a ride in the Healey if the weather was nice. Amsterdam is a great place to visit, but I have been there several times before. Then I remembered reading there was a Healey museum in Holland. I did a bit of online research and it was right on my way to the airport, where I was schedule to spend the night. Perfect! Problem solved!



As I sit here afterward looking at the brochure I took with me after my visit, it says "Please do not take the road through the village of Vreeland. It is very narrow and is not suited for ongoing traffic." That proved an understatement. The GPS in the rental car was a challenge; the "road" was indeed very narrow, but I finally found it. And wow- what a find! I got there around 2pm, and when I entered, I was the only visitor. Hans and Ria van de Kerkhof greeted me and asked if I wanted anything to drink. Seeing a small bar/ serving area, I inquired if they also had any lunch I could buy. Ria said they were about to have lunch anyway and set out another place for me (on Healey placemats on a British flag table cloth no less)!

After lunch Hans gave me a personal tour of the museum, which was fascinating. It wasn't just about the cars; there was a distinct focus on Donald Healey and his history. According to the brochure, the museum foundation was created "to preserve the cultural heritage of Donald Mitchell Healey and the products of the Donald Healey Motor Company for future generations by conservation and exhibiting the rich history of the Healey brand and the people behind it."

There were Warwick built Healeys, including a Sportsmobile from 1949 and a Silverstone roadster from 1950. A Triumph 7 that Donald raced in the Monte Carlo Rally through cold and snow with no heater was also on display. There were showcases full of models, miniatures, historic photos, and Donald's original trophy case. Donald's personal hard top Healey was prominently displayed.

Naturally I was pleased to see a Pacific Green car in the collection!

Did you know there was a BN3 (almost)? I didn't. Apparently, this car was found in Toronto, and the new owner tried to find out the availability of parts. He asked a friend who was knowledgeable about Healeys, who in turn asked the owner to find a chassis or car number so he had some idea of what it was.

The owner said BN3... and the friend said "that's impossible." Further research revealed that it was a BN3-4 prototype shipped to NYC that added several inches behind the front seats in order to accommodate two rear seats, which were added to avoid some sort of import tax that was levied on "sports cars" which back then were defined as having only two seats .

It had an Austin straight six low-compression engine from a Wolseley (dark green one on the bench in the background of the BN3-4 prototype picture) that lacked the strengthening ribs on the lower block like the later sixes. It couldn't fit into the engine bay, so the entire chassis was re-designed to accommodate a bolt-on front suspension that had to be removed to get the engine in place. It also curved above the rear axle. If I remember correctly, he said there were only 3 made, and one is in Australia.

Hans has had the bodywork completely restored in its original gray primer, and the display is awesome, complete with floor mirrors!

Another car of interest was a prototype of a successor to the BJ8, intended for the U.S. market. In this case, there were safety regulation changes around that time, and as part of the remodel, they cut the cart in half lengthwise, and widened it 6". They used a lot of leftover parts as a cost savings, (note the wrap-around bumper and small running lights) and it sported a six-cylinder Rolls-Royce aluminum engine and automatic transmission, both of which were was actually lighter than the Austin motor. The badging on the boot lid was something you don't see every day.

In the back corner of the museum under lock and key is a treasure trove of records and documentation from the original factory vaults. Correspondence from vendors, design specs ad campaigns, it was all there. Hans showed me some of those originals here.

Hans and Ria are great hosts who care deeply about the museum foundation.

If you are anywhere near Amsterdam, (30 minutes or so by car) make it a point to visit. I am grateful I had to opportunity to get to know them a little, and see such a rich history of the cars we love. I learned a lot and was reminded that these cars and their history have a power beyond their HP ratings; they have the power to create and bond friendships.
