PRESIDENT'S LETTER

TAKING STOCK...

In the nine months since we announced the Wing concept, lots has happened in the Club. We now have 318 members including 27 new members this year. This is over 10% of the national club's membership. In the last six years, we've added 93 new members, almost one-third of the Club. Welcome to new members and all of our existing members who helped introduce the new folks to the Club.

One goal of the Wing concept was to bring the Club closer to its membership with each of our Wings hosting local events. We have done that with events in every Wing. Thom Webster's Lobster Feed and Boat Cruise attracted 49 Club members from every Wing in the Club. Our Spring event to tour the Roosevelt Mansion had members from three Wings. Clearly Wings have no fences.

This past year we've done four surveys of Club members to get your input to help organize the Club's activities. One was a general survey where we learned the number #1 reason for joining the Club was Tech information. 43% or 42 of the 105 members who responded asked for event information more than 4 weeks in advance, 85% or 85 Club Members said more than three weeks. Over 60% or 61 of you said you wanted event specific mailings. 80% or 81 of you said you wanted events closer to home, reinforcing the Wing concept.

In response to the request for Tech Information, we did a Tech survey and initiated Tech Sessions by conference phone where each month over 20 Club members participate in discussions of various Technical subjects. 44 Club Members said Tech Notes were the first thing they read in Exhaust Notes.

Healey's in the Berkshires – Summit 2017 was a big success and your comments were universally positive. Great input was given by the women in the Ladies Survey. All this information will be used by next year's Summit Committee to help plan Summit 2018.

The Website has added a Members Only section that features a Resource Guide and a guide to on-line services. Club members are using these valuable resources. We've nearly doubled the number of Club initiated events and while we'd like to see a few more of you at events, we are seeing lots of new faces and everyone attending has been enthusiastic.

Our newsletter Exhaust Notes continues to be one of the finest newsletters in the National Club. All of this has been accomplished by a dedicated group of Wing Coordinators, Club Directors and Club Members. We owe them all a special thanks.
