Route 114 West take a Right onto Route 125 towards North Andover follow route 125 North for approximately 4 miles. 1600 Osgood Street will be on your left.



NUTS & BOLTS CORNER

I enjoy the monthly Tech Calls and last month's Tech Conference Call brought back a memory.


One participant asked about how often he should do maintenance of his SUs? It reminded me of a chapter on carburetors in one of my all time favorite books going back to my formative years with British sports cars......"How To Repair Your Foreign Car - a guide for the beginner, your wife and the mechanically inept."

The author, Dick O'Kane, had an occasional column in "Road & Track" magazine that was very entertaining. He was like a precursor to Peter Egan. The book is also very technical, providing sound advice while infused with humorous anecdotes. And there are numerous hand drawn pictures. It is a great book and available on Amazon or eBay for less that \$20.00. It was copyrighted in 1968. Below is a screen shot of the cover.

The point of this note is Chapter 13 in the book.

The sub title is "Carburetor" is a French word meaning "Leave it Alone". This echoes the discussion at the monthly conference call.

The first two paragraphs of the chapter also support this advice......



Back in the late forties and early fifties, when the sports and foreign car thing got started in this country, a myth got started which persists to this day:

that if you owned a sports car, you could look forward to many happy hours of playing around with the carburetors because they just naturally are always getting out of adjustment.

As I say, it's a **myth**. And if you believe it, it can cause yourself untold trouble, delay, money and grief.

In reality, a carburetor's only real natural enemy is its owner, and the mount of trouble you'll have with them is in direct proportion to the amount of fooling around with them you do. It follows, then, that if you leave them entirely alone, you'll probably have no trouble at all !!!

Club Donates \$4,260 to Bionic Pancreas Research

Several Club members have grown children with Type 1 Diabetes and at the Club's Annual Meeting in 2016 we designated the Boston University Bionic Pancreas Project as our official charity for 2016.

On Monday, September 25th Jud Perkins presented on behalf of the Austin Healey Club of New England a check for \$4,260 to Dr. Ed Damiano, the head of the Bionic Pancreas project at Boston University: http://bionicpancreas.org/. The majority of the funds were from our F-1 auction in 2016.

Dr. Damiano is a PhD mechanical engineer whose 11-month-old son was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes. Dr. Damiano then embarked on a project to develop the Bionic Pancreas. His son is now 17.

Dr. Damiano was extremely gracious with his time. He brought us up to date with the status of the project. He explained the functioning of the Bionic Pancreas as follows:

Today, the state of the art is an insulin pump connected to a constant glucose monitor. A user



then programs the pump for their anticipated insulin needs for the day based on planned activities, meal periods, etc. The user gets a warning if their blood sugars go high or low. They can then manually adjust their insulin or glucose levels with food or in extreme cases an injection of glucagon. Glucagon is inherently unstable and can't be stored in a pump as insulin can be. Current advancements now make the insulin dose "automatic" but the glucagon challenge still remains. Dr. Damiano likened this to a car on cruise control that can be programed for known road conditions but must be manually adjusted if conditions change.

Dr. Damiano explained the bionic pancreas using the automobile example as a totally self-driving car, the only input required will be the user's weight. The Bionic Pancreas will constantly measure a diabetic's blood sugar and inject the appropriate amounts of insulin or glucagon as the user goes about their day. The user can be totally passive. The result being the Bionic Pancreas will be mimicking the functioning of a normal healthy pancreas. The glucagon problem has apparently been solved by the development of a synthetic glucagon in Europe. The Bionic Pancreas will also be able to be used for chronically low blood sugars.

The status of the project is, in 2018 they will begin human testing of the actual device with the plan of having government approval in Europe in 2019 and the US by 2020. The device is classed differently in Europe than the US hence the shorter process. Mass General is one of the hospitals conducting the tests and people in the Boston area can apply to be subjects. If approved in Europe in 2019 it could be bought there but used here. Someone would need a friend in Europe to mail supplies, etc.

Club Donates \$ 4,260 to Bionic Pancreas Research

In the diabetes world the potential for this project will be a total life changer, gone will be constant blood sugar testing, insulin injections, worries about high and low blood sugars. One of the biggest areas of benefit will be with people who do not take care of themselves as this will minimize what they have to do and hopefully eliminate many of the complications from poor control. Wild card in the whole equation will be the insurance companies position on the device.

I have been attending the British Invasion since 1992 having only missed the first one in 1991.

The weather for British Invasion XXVII was by far the best weather ever for the 3 day festival that I can recall. All three days were sunny with temperatures in the low 80's. Shorts, tee shirts and sandals were the dress for the event and I'm sure many ventured into the pools at the various inns and hotels to cool off.

At the reception on the show field Friday afternoon the event organizer, Michael Gaetano, announced that they had exceeded 600 registrations and were still taking more.

The annual block party street dance in downtown Stowe was a blast and featured a live band playing tunes from the 50's, 60's, 70's and 80's.

Their horn section kept the crowd dancing until almost 10PM when the noise curfew was about to set in.

They tried a new system this year in hopes that it would speed up the ballot counting process but in fact it was more tedious so at 4 PM the organizers announced that the award ceremony would be postponed until 10AM on Sunday.
