Our subject was distributors. And our guru was Rob Medynski of British Vacuum Units from Canterbury, NH. Rob's business is ignition parts and rebuilding distributors. I think anyone who attended would agree that Rob's knowledge and understanding of the subject is fa-nominal. For two hours he explained about condensers, vacuum advance, and the difference between cam shaft advance and ignition advance. Very informative and enlightening to realize how these things will effect mileage, performance and engine temperature.



# **NUTS & BOLTS CORNER**



Below are some of the recommendations made by Allen Hendrix from Hendrix Wire Wheel at our December  $11^{
m th}\,$  Technical Conference Call.





#### Allen Hendrix on Shuttle shake:

To start trouble shooting your 'shuttle shake',
Start with the simple way: - work outward to inward
If the drums are out of balance, it will vibrate
At least once a year check front shocks, alignment, idler, etc. >>any play will cause vibration
Wheels & tires work up vibration at 55-65 mph; with higher speed 65-80mph,
you will get higher vibration. Even higher, then it is getting into the drums

#### Peter Sturtevant asked:

Are wire wheels or the tires the bigger problem?

Usually tires are not as big a problem – even brand new tires may have a 'set' flat spot due to basic manufacturing process

#### Peter Sturtevant asked:

When people send wheels and tires, are you able to adjust them? Most often, Hendrix Wire Wheels can 'true' them.

#### Bill Beyer asked:

Is it necessary to fit specific tires to specific wheels?
You don't want too wide a tire on too narrow a rim
Width is most critical thing when choosing your tire.
If you like to race, you may want stronger wheels/spokes



#### Allen Hendrix on Tire brand;

Allen Hendrix recommends: *Vredestein* from Holland, they are in his view the best tires. Due to the European safety inspection, tires on classic automobiles have to match the original size.

So, approx. 20 years ago, Vredestein started to manufacture # 165 tires. Over the years, they have improved the look of the tire and they now look very nice & period correct.

Nexen from China also manufactures a very good tire.

Allen Hendrix highly recommends that you replace your tires **at least every 10 years**. He stated, that no matter how good they look, you should not run on tires older than 10 years, since they will dry-rot, with the risk of having a blow-out.

Since the 1980's, DOT requires that all tires have a manufacturing code with year/date to show age of tire. This makes it easier to decide when to replace your tires.

#### Allen Hendrix on Tire brand & tire size: 165 / 185 / 205?

What size tire you choose to put on your car, depends mostly on your driving style and your budget.

If you like to participate in things such as gymkhana, then choose a bigger tire (with a larger price tag)

If you are more of a 'speed limit abiding' driver, then a 165 size will be a good choice for you The 165 size tire is skinnier and therefore easier to turn car

#### Allen Hendrix on Rotating Tires:

While it is ok to rotate your tires, you will want to check first **why** there is a need to rotate If car is 'toe in or toe out' it will affect wear and shake.

Generally it will be fine to rotate your tires if you have new wheels.

With very old worn wheels, you should put the worst wheel at right rear.

#### Allen Hendrix on Painting your wheels:

Many owner like to have their wire wheels sandblasted & painted.
Hendrix will be able to do that for you, if the wheels are still in good condition.
Before you spend a lot of money on rehabbing your old wheels, give your rims a thorough inspection. Often it is safer and more economical to just replace the wheels, rather than go through the expense of respoking, sandblasting & rechroming your wheels.

# 2017 AUSTIN HEALEY CLUB OF NEW ENGLAND ANNUAL SURVEY RESULTS

**Last year** we had the great participation ever in our annual club member survey with **114** completed which is over a third of our total membership. For the 2017 annual survey we upgraded to a new tool called **SurveyPlanet**, which allowed more questions than our previous tool.

We started with the demographic questions about our members. The average club member who answered the survey is 68 years old and has been a member for almost 13 years. Overall, the Wing concept has received very positive feedback from the members, and I believe this has delivered the highest percentage of members attending the most events in 2017.

Distance and my Healey is not on the road are the primary reasons why members did not attend any club events during 2017. With the 7 Wings across the New England Region, events should be much closer to members than in the past.

**For 2018**, members are most interested in more **Driving Tours**, **Technical Sessions**, and **Tours** of **places of historical significance**. **Healey Seaside Summit in 2018** will be at Endicott College in Beverly MA, August 5<sup>th</sup> to the 9<sup>th</sup> and **fifty percent** of the members who completed the survey are planning of attending.

The monthly **Technical Conference** calls have been a very popular addition in 2017 which members have enjoyed, including ways to minimize Healey "scuttle shake", assuring your cars are more reliable, and improved performance. Three quarters of the members use the club website **www.ahca-newengland.org** on a regular basis to read the monthly Healey Exhaust Notes newsletter and keep track of future club events.

Our successful club newsletter is published monthly and is a great source of all things Healey. Members enjoy the month President's Letter, Technical Articles, and summaries of past events and notices of future meetings. Another new idea introduced through the newsletter was a photo contest for the best pictures capturing the essence of the Austin Healey.

Fortunately, ninety percent of our Healeys are on the road and members are comfortable driving their cars long distances.

Many great ideas have been suggested for 2018 which the Wing Coordinators are working to develop exciting events for our members. Members like the fact the club is very active and friendly. The enthusiasm of members and willingness to share information freely between each other is another positive aspect of the club.

For 2018, the club is going focus on being **more inclusive for women**. We have an open **Woman's Coordinator** position to assure future growth of the club and will be sharing club communication and updates to our spouses. 

# THE TALE OF THE INNOCENTI SPRITE BY STEVE BELL

#### THE INNOCENTI SPRITE - WHERE DID IT COME FROM?

Were you a wee bit intrigued by the reference to the "Italian Spider" in last month's newsletter?



Well, for those of you who would like to know a little more about the Innocenti, there is a great Sprite book written by Terry Horler that has served Sprite owners well over the years. It contains a wealth of production information, facts and figures and additional including a brief paragraph or two on the Innocenti Spider.

Very quickly and simply, Italy in post WWII was looking to produce cheap and economical transportation for their population. Ferdinand Innocenti was producing steel tubing after the war and through his efforts the Lambreta Motor Scooter came to fruition and their product was an immediate financial success in Italy. Buoyed by his success they expanded into the automobile market taking uncompleted Austin A40's, finishing the car with a totally different interior, gauges,

amenities and also included some exterior badging. Now called the Austin A40 Farina, the result was another success which rolled out of the factory doors in Turin and Milan.

Meanwhile, back in Jolly Old England, AN5 chassis were beginning to pile up in Abingdon and a deal was struck with Innocenti. Innocent could import the drive train in a knocked-down kit from BMC, and because they were not complete vehicles, the duties and taxes were minimal. Tom Tjaarda, a recent graduate of University of Michigan, got a design job with Carozzeria Ghia in Turin. His first design assignment was the Innocenti Spider 950. Tom went on to design for Ferrari and DeTomaso and after a productive career in Turin eventually founding his own design studio. Sadly he passed away this past June (2017).

After reading Horlers Book, I became curious about these Innocenti Spiders. Thanks to Ebay, one showed up near Bangor, Maine at a time when most folks had never even heard of the Innocenti Spider. Now over forty years old, these cars had all but been forgotten, Italian spare parts did not exist and the rust-worm had done it's job quite well.

I went to look at the car and brought my trailer along just in case. Was I the start of "Bring a Trailer.com"? Well, the car came home with me and I quickly learned that, had this been an ordinary Sprite, I would have cut it up and trashed it.

Now that most of the metal replacement has been completed, 9 years working one night a week, the final adjustments, welding and straightening will have the chassis ready for a Spring blast and primer spray



I did find a small network of guys who knew the cars and were attempting to put together a network of information. The biggest concern was manufacturing your own body panels and rear suspension parts. Within two years I had bought another car out of the Buffalo area to use as a parts car, because even Ebay did not turn up much in the way of useful parts. With time and effort, I met hobbyists from Europe as well as the US who certainly knew more about these cars, and, where some parts could be obtained, modified and made to fit the application for the Spider.

Because of the lack of information about these cars, I started my own registry, my own parts lists including original parts numbers and documenting everything I found as I began taking the cars apart. Through diligent research and the continual pouring over Ebay listings I was able to source an original parts manual as well as an original owners manual, both of which changed the Innocenti world for me.



Fast forward to approximately 2010 and the internet had opened up all new avenues of possibilities. Now I spend a great deal of time on Italian Ebay (Ebay.it), I publish a small newsletter for the **OIIO**, the Organization of International Innocenti Owners, and I am in contact with about 30 gentlemen going through the trials of restoring these cars.

We are helping each other source parts (my parts ca re-lives in at least five other cars) and we are finding that Italian vendors are now recognizing and selling small amounts of original Innocenti Spider parts. To that end, I just returned from a trip to Europe where I met up with three other "enthusiasts" as we took in the huge Auto D'epoca car show in Padova, Italy. There I found some un-obtainium, educated a few others as to what they had and also made some great contacts with companies looking to provide additional spare parts to hobbyist. My restoration project has 40% new sheet metal on it, substantial repairs have been made to another 30% of the panels and my attention is now on completing the re-manufacture of rear suspension parts including making and pouring my own rear end bushings with the help of Domenic Falconeiri's friend, Richard Frazier.

It has all been great fun. I have learned extreme patience. I have improved so many of my skills as a restorer, I have made many new friends and associates and I have travelled across the Atlantic while using the Innocenti Spider as an excuse. What a great time! There is currently another rust-bucket for sale on Ebay for \$1500. Interested?

MARCH 2017: Ted Cryer treated us to a detailed report on several collector car auctions he attended while visiting Scottsdale, AZ, in January.





This car was purchased in 2012, and it went through a 5 year 100% restoration by the owner. The car and every mechanical component was completely disassembled and restored and rebuilt. During this time the semi monocoque frame was mounted on a rotisserie for about 1 ½ years. Sandblasting, re-fabrication of



rusted parts, were reinstalled with painstaking welding and grinding. Sheet metal parts were hand embossed to match original parts exactly.

Rust preventative primers as well as filling primers, were applied to frame. Color coats as well as Urethane top coats completed the semi monocoque frame. There are approx. 1000 photographs of the restoration project.

All numbers match from chassis, body, engine, as well as all hidden parts, that were originally marked. All ID plates are original. British Heritage Certificate comes with the car.
