Intercontinental Lubricants Corp. (ILC) of Brookfield, Connecticut (claims to be) one of the world's foremost manufacturers and packagers of quality lubricants. **John Dunne**, their Brand Manager for Spectro Oils, will be the Presenter for the Spring Tech Session.



2018 AUSTIN HEALEY CLUB OF NEW ENGLAND MEMBER MODEL OWNERSHIP PROFILE

The Austin Healey Club of New England is far and away largest of the 46 regional clubs of the Austin Healey Club of America, with 330 members in 2018, which accounts for over twelve percent of total AHCA. We are currently aware of 360 Austin Healeys, owned by our members. 53 AHC of NE members, own multiple Austin Healey's with the most popular combination a Big Healey and a Sprite, with a BJ8 and a Bugeye the most prevalent pair.

The last of the Big Healey's the BJ8, were produced from '64 to '67, and have the best survival rate, and are the most popular in NE, as you can see on the chart below. Of the 360 cars known to be owned by club members, 148 are BJ8's, or 42% of the total Austin Healeys in the region. Seventeen thousand BJ8's were produced, or roughly eight percent to the total Austin Healey production, and the survival rate in NE is over 5 times that of the other models. The Big Healey model BJ8 which has the greatest survival rate at the end of the production line, are those most valuable today, except for the much rarer 100-M's, and tri carb BN7's.

For Sprites, it is just the opposite, to their big brothers. The MK I (known as Bugeye's in America), was the first built, and largest production quantity, but also the most valuable, and have the greatest survival rate of all Sprites.

88 percent of all Sprites, 42 known to be owned by members in NE, are Bugeye's, but their survival rate is only .5 times compared to 6.7 times for a 100-M and 3.4 times for a BN7.

We are only aware of 4 "square" Sprites owned by club members. In total, there were 137k Sprites manufactured from 1958 to 1971, or 62 percent of the total production, compared to 65k Big Healey's produced from 1952 to 1967.

Big Healey survive today in New England is ten times greater rate than Sprites.



Ivan received a B.S. degree in Physics from the University of Minnesota and a M.S. in Radio logical Physics from the University of Rochester. After graduation, Ivan taught Physics at Minnesota State and established the college's first Nuclear Physics program. After three years in academia, Ivan left to pursue a career in nuclear pharmaceuticals at 3M in St. Paul, MN.

While at 3M, Ivan developed radioactive pharmaceuticals, receiving three U.S. patents and a national award. Ivan could build anything, fix anything and was extremely generous with his talents. When Gwen needed a table to fit the whole family for Thanksgiving, Ivan built it. When the Atkinson Congregational Church needed a new cross to hang behind the altar, Ivan built it. Whenever anyone needed anything, Ivan was there. While his mind was that of a brilliant scientist, his hands were those of a carpenter, rough and capable.

Ivan and his son Neal jointly owned a Austin Healey BT7-1 for many years.

Manny has been restoring this 38k mile two owner Phase 2 BJ8 for over ten years. The car was purchased as a non-running project in Virginia, while Manny and his wife Donna were living in Charlottesville. When they returned to New England and moved to Attleboro, the Healey project made the trip north to their detached one car garage, and parts were stored and restored in many rooms in their lovely Victorian home.



Five weeks ago, Manny's BJ8 running chassis was towed to my heated Healey workshop with all the spare parts in convoy in half a dozen additional vehicles.

Two weeks prior, on a cold Saturday February afternoon, the straight six fired to life, after sitting on the garage floor for many years. Manny took his wife Donna for a drive in the chassis without a single body panel and seats mounted temporarily.

A quick switch was made and the old girl fired to life with a huge applause from the group of on lookers, including Donna and Sarah. We told them they must have the first drive in Manny's car, with all the body panels installed looking like a proper Healey. Donna jumped in the driver's seat accompanied by her navigator-videographer daughter. Their smiles were ear to ear, as they drove the BJ8 around the cull de sac and down Cedar Ridge Lane running through the gears and even the overdrive works!

The new labeling changes were simply made to conform to CA law requirements.

- 5) In Linda Hakala's absence, Jud reviewed the Club's financial statement. As of March 23, the Club has a cash balance of \$18,637.99. Expenses have exceeded YTD revenues by approx. \$3,800 the majority of which is the Club's \$3,000 subsidy of Summit 2018 and a late billing from the Jiminy Peak Resort from Summit 2017. The Club's \$3,000 contribution to Summit is a match of a \$3,000 contribution from an anonymous donor and has been used to subsidize for Summit attendees the Wylie Hotel room rate (\$20 per night) and the Summit Banquet.
- 6) In Linda Hakala's absence, Jud reviewed the membership report. In 2017 we had 32 new members join the Club, and in November 2017 we had 325 members. Though the renewal process to date we have 297 members. The drop is due to the passing of some members, members selling their cars, moving from the area (12 total) with the balance unexplained. We have 5 new members so far this year.
- 7) All attendees complimented Dutcha on the quality of the Healey Exhaust Notes. She requested that everyone should try to submit articles. For consistency and ease of inclusion they should be submitted as Word documents and photos should be separate attachments as JPG files. The photo competition was discussed, the general consensus was that it was a positive. Dutcha mentioned that in many of past several months National has included stories from Exhaust Notes in the Healey Marque, including the photo competition.
- 8) Norm Lamontagne (Wing 4) made a presentation (copy attached) for an Austin Healey men's and woman's ring that he was developed in conjunction with Jostens and Herff-Jones. The project would require a one-time tooling cost of approximately \$1,100 for the men's ring. Once the tooling is done the rings could then be produced to individual order. Depending on the material, ring costs ranged from \$133 to \$705. The attendees felt that this project would have appeal and a broader market to the entire Austin Healey Club at the National Club level. We are fortunate as Steve Bell is the National Regalia coordinator. The attendees felt Steve would be in the best position to present the concept to National. It was suggested that the ring could be featured in the cover of the Healey Marque with an accompanying story on its development. The group felt Steve again was best positioned to bring this about.
- 9) Jud reviewed that this years' Summit will be the most successful in recent memory with 63 cars currently registered four months before the event. The Wylie Inn and Conference Center has only 91 rooms. We have been at risk that the hotel could sell out limiting our availability. As of this date Club members have reserved 57 rooms at the Wylie. To preserve rooms for future business the Wylie has chosen to cap our rooms at this level. As a result, future registrants will need to find accommodations in the area. Wylie has rooms at market rates on Expedia and other sites. We suggest additional Summit attendees secure rooms using on-line sites.
- 10) Rick reviewed the status of Summit. He asked for members help in staffing the event. Specifically, in the following areas Transportation Coordinator, Car Show Organizer, Lobster Feed Help, Goody Bag Stuffers, Beach Party Helpers, Gymkhana course workers and general event assistance. Another neat little technical trick from Jim Begin:

Lucas Replacement Wiring Harness Smoke Description

Have you inadvertently let the smoke out of the wires on your classic British car?

This, then, is the solution to your problem!



Here is presented for your perusal one Lucas Replacement Wiring Harness Smoke kit, P/N 530433, along with the very rare Churchill Tool 18G548BS adapter tube and metering valve.

These kits were supplied surreptitiously to Lucas factory technicians as a trouble-shooting and repair aid for the rectification of chronic electrical problems on a plethora of British cars. The smoke is metered, through the fuse box, into the circuit which has released its original smoke until the leak is located and repaired. The affected circuit is then rectified and the replacement smoke re-introduced.

An advantage over the cheap repro smoke kits currently available is the exceptionally rare Churchill metering valve and fuse box adapter. It enables the intrepid and highly skilled British Car Technician to meter the precise amount of genuine Lucas smoke required by the circuit.

Unlike the cheap, far-eastern replacement DIY-smoke, this kit includes a filter to ensure that all the smoke is of consistent size. It has been our experience in our shop that the reproduction far-eastern smoke is often "lumpy", which will cause excessive resistance in our finely engineered British harnesses and components.

This Genuine Factory Authorized kit contains enough smoke to recharge the entire window circuit on a 420 Jaguar, and my dear friend and advisor George Wolf of British Auto Specialty assures me that he can replace ALL the smoke in a W&F Barrett All-Weather Invalid Car(147 CC) with enough left over to test a whole box of Wind-Tone horns for escaped smoke. How much more of an endorsement do you need?

FAQs:

Q: Once I have re-introduced smoke into my Austin Healey 3000 Mk II BJ-7, do you warranty that its system will resume operating at the speed of dark?

A: If you reintroduce the smoke through a microwave oven, you may even go back in time!

Q: I have been diligent over the years in maintaining the smoke in my 100-6 BN4 wires. The problem is that that special Lucas perfume has disappeared from the dash, carpets and seats. Is the smoke in your kit fresh enough to bring back the OEM smells of burning plastic and bakelite? Also, are you including an adaptor to replace the same?

A: No adaptor needed. But have you tried just STARTING that over-restored Trailer Queen? It might bring back the aroma by itself.

Q: Does this unit contain new or recycled smoke and will it work on my Sprite Mk !?

A: This is new, previously un-leaked smoke, as originally installed on your Sprite Mk I. Get it!

Q: Is this setup on the "metric system" or can it be used universally?

A: This is setup is Whitworth only—sorry.



A Visit to the Curtiss Museum Planes-Boats-Motorcycles- Cars & More

I know this should be Healey content and although I own a BJ8, I took this ride on my motorcycle – but I thought it would also be a great trip to do in my Healey (or you in yours) so I thought I would share. My motorcycle riding buddy Dave Pelletier and myself had planned a late fall ride to the *Barber Museum* in Alabama – but decided to scale down our ride.

We loaded up our Suzuki V Stroms and left at 6:30 on a Friday morning from SE Massachusetts. We were blessed with excellent weather and enjoyed the long route ride to the *Curtiss Museum* in Hammondsport, NY by going through the back roads of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, the Adirondacks, the Catskills and lastly Connecticut.

Day 1

We decided we would head out to western Massachusetts (Routes 146 north from Providence, RI, then from Oxford, MA routes 56, to 122 to 78 into NH. Then route 9 to route 100 in Vermont (a really great road for motorcycles or Healeys! – twisties and not a lot of traffic!).

Then instead of going to Burlington and taking the ferry over to Plattsburgh, we took route 17 west and crossed over the bridge at Crown Point, NY then up the west side of Lake Champlain (routes 22 and 9N) to Plattsburgh.

Once headed to Plattsburgh I remembered the views from Clinton Community College south of Plattsburgh of Lake Champlain were spectacular so a ride to there and picture below. This is a shot of the historic Valcour Island to the Southeast.



The naval Battle of Valcour Island took place on October 11, 1776, on Lake Champlain. The main action took place in Valcour Bay, a narrow strait between the New York mainland and Valcour Island. The battle is generally regarded as one of the first naval battles of the American Revolutionary War, and one of the first fought by the United States Navy. Most of the ships in the American fleet under the command of Benedict Arnold were captured or destroyed by a British force under the overall direction of General Guy Carleton.

However, the American defense of Lake Champlain stalled British plans to reach the upper Hudson River valley.

On the way we also stopped at Ausable Chasm which is the "Grand Canyon of the Adirondacks"—there is a lot to do here, exploring and rafting.

<u>Day 2</u>

We had planned this to be a more relaxing day and started out by visiting Lake City Choppers – a motorcycle dealer - quite a place! I wanted to visit the dealership as when I lived there they had an Austin Healey on the showroom floor (identical to one I own). The Owner, Casey Spiegel greeted us and told me the Healey belonged to his father and was there for a short period of time.

We next visited the area around Plattsburgh then up the back roads to Point Au Roche State Park, Rouses Point, NY then over the Vermont Bridge to the Vermont Islands in Lake Champlain and a visit to Saint Anne's Shrine while there.

There are many historical markers along the roads so one can learn a lot of history of the area. It was a great and relaxing day and we focused on getting lost by taking roads that we knew went right along the Lake – beautiful views all the way!

Back to the hotel! Only 148 miles this day – but all were beautiful!

Day 3

This was our day to tour the Adirondacks and get to Hammondsport, NY or as close to it as we could. We started down route 9, to 86 to 3 to 30 (Tupper and Blue Mountain Lakes) then 12/28 to 12 (Old Forge, Alder Creek) through Oneida and Utica then 20 West to Geneva (Finger Lakes Region – Lake Seneca – beautiful – and we stayed there that night). We also wanted to go through Lake Placid (site of the winter Olympic Games in 1932 and 1980).

Riding through the Adirondacks is awesome with not a lot of traffic on two lane twisty roads with many hills and valleys. The roads are excellent and around every turn are new vistas to behold! We did 328 miles this day and were at the hotel around 6 PM.

Once one leaves the Adirondacks and gets south of Utica you enter rolling farmland – much larger farms than in my town – lots of corn and dairy and the topography is not unlike Pennsylvania.

This is our ride home day and we left Kingston at 8AM and headed north on 199 to the Rhinecliff Bridge and stopped to have breakfast in Rhinebeck, NY. A great town with a large park for events as well as the Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome where there are air shows. We stayed on route 199 out of town headed to route 44 in Connecticut which is also scenic – especially at the beginning. We stopped at our favorite "ride to" restaurant the Vanilla Bean in Pomfret, CT – always a great place to visit and have something to eat – and always lots of Motorcycles and interesting cars in the parking lot!
