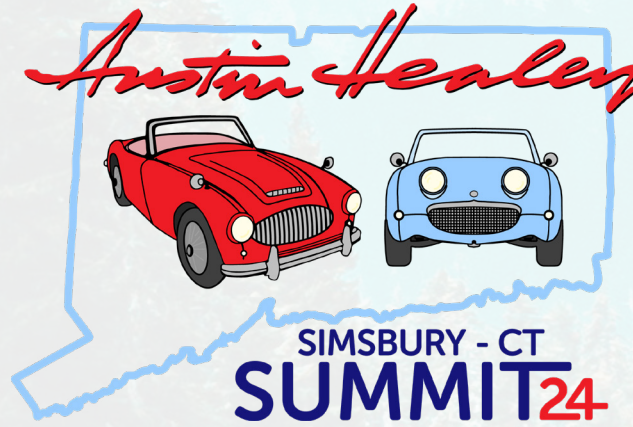

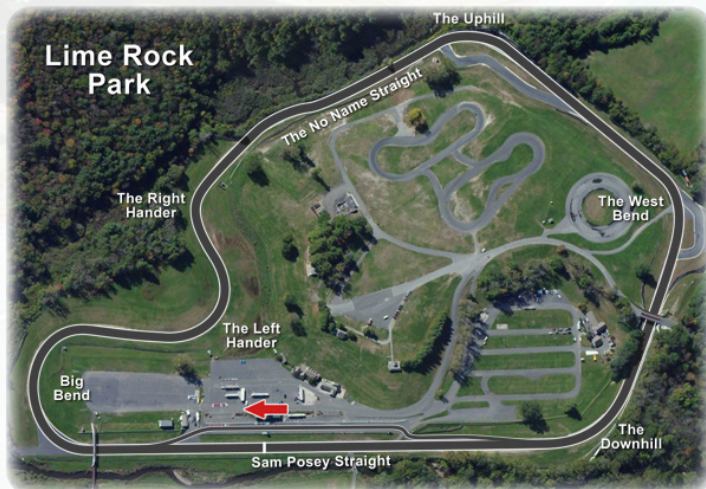

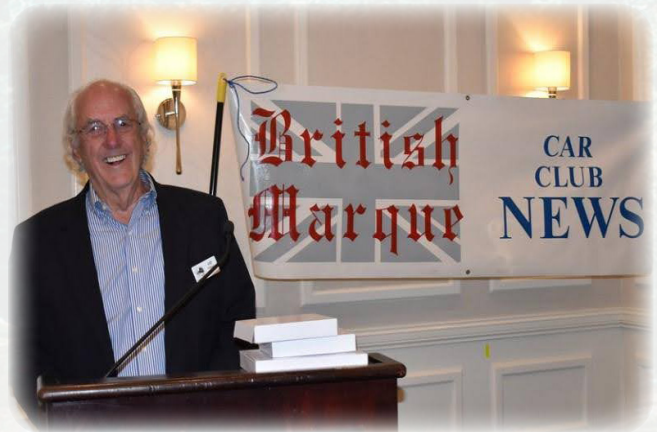

Double Dip 2” Tech Session January 24

A little snow didn't deter 16 members of the Austin Healey Club of New England from coming together, to help fellow members Frank Jacques and Ted Stanton, for the Double Dip 2 tech session. Three weeks after the second tech session to get Frank's Bugeye Sprite running for a few seconds with fuel from a cup, the Mark 1 Sprite, saw more progress. We started by removing the rusted gas tank and fuel line. What a difference with a new gas tank, and fuel line direct to the fuel pump. The fuel pump was caulked full of crude. The one team took the fuel pump apart, while another installed the tank with a new sending unit and uncoiled the fuel line and using the old one as a template, to bend the line to fit nicely from the front of the tank to the pump. The team also installed a 1275 exhaust manifold and front pipe provided by Alan Fisher. The 948-exhaust manifold and coupler are prone to leaking compared to the must better later design. One new set of rebuilt H1 carburetors and heat shield restored by Bob Abbott of British Car R&R were installed and fit nicely above the new exhaust system. A couple of gallons of gas was added to the tank, and after priming the newly cleaned fuel pump, the motor started and ran great.

While one team focused on Frank's Sprite, the other team turned over Ted's 100 motor, upside down on the engine stand, to access the oil pan. This motor has been sitting in Ted's garage for four decades. Three weeks ago, we were able to turn over the motor freely, and we removed the head to expose excellent looking cylinder walls and top of the pistons. By removing the oil pan, we were able to hear and see the crank and pistons moving up and down through the cylinder walls freely. The cam looks great, and in addition to the dented oil pan which will need to be replaced, a new oil pump strainer will be required. This 100 motor is an excellent candidate for a rebuild for your BN1 or BN2. There are not many 100 motors available for rebuilding, so if you are interested in this motor, is available for \$1500 delivered in New England, with proceeds to Ted and the club 2024 charity. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am by President Bruce Ketchen.

1. Bruce Ketchen's Opening Comments:
 - Bruce extended his thanks to everyone for all of their work throughout the past year.
 - Special thanks to Jud Perkins for organizing Summit 2023 in Mystic.
 - Club is in good financial standing.
 - Bruce highlighted several of our club's meets and events in 2023.
 - Thanks to Peter Sturtevant for all of his tech sessions, both on Zoom and in-person at his garage.
2. Approval of minutes from the 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM): Motion made by Carl Carvell and seconded by Dana Booth to approve the minutes from the 2023 AGM. Motion passed.
3. 2024 Elections:

Ed Collins made a motion to accept the proposed slate of officers. Dana Booth seconded the motion. Single vote cast by acclamation by Secretary Bev Sealand. Motion passed.

Meeting was turned over to incoming President Art Harvey.

Art recognized Bruce Ketchen for his service and displayed pictures of a gift of a personalized engraved saw that has been ordered to honor his service as our President for the past two years.

Art also recognized Steve Bell for his 20+ years as our Club Delegate prior to his recent move to Florida.

4. Treasurer's and Membership Report – Linda Hakala
Treasurer's Report:
 - Balance in our accounts (main account and Summit account) is \$32,901.63.
 - Received almost \$6,900 in profits from co-hosting Enclave.

Bruce Ketchen made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Ed Collins seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Membership Report:

- We had 39 new members in 2023, and already have 2 new members in 2024. • New members Harvey Wooding (2024) and David Frances (2023) were on the call.

5. Secretary's Report – Bev Sealand
During the bylaws review, the committee realized that the fiscal year spelled out in Article VII, Section 3 is not in alignment with our incorporation with the State of Massachusetts. Bev made a motion that we correct this to change our fiscal year from October 1st through September 30th to be calendar year. Rick Neville seconded the motion. Motion passed. This will require us to file a second tax return for October 2023 through December 2023 to bring our tax reporting into alignment with this change. Linda Hakala will handle this.
6. National Delegate's Report – Steve Bell
Steve's report is on the website and was included in the December Healey Exhaust Notes (HEN).
7. Communications Director – Peter Sturtevant
 - Peter pointed out that our list of events on the website calendar are in chronological order, so the next event will always be at the top of the list.
 - Peter shared some statistics on the website access, which shows that access spikes when a new issue of the HEN comes out. Concerns were raised that even this spike seems low. It is possible that these stats do not capture when someone reads the newsletter via the link in their email. Peter will check with ClubExpress (CE), that sends out the emails, to see what the open rate is for these emails.
 - Peter reviewed a number of items that are in the Members Only section.
8. Old Business:
 - a. Mystical Summit 2023 – Jud Perkins:
