May 26 Thursday - Wings Over The Hudson

If you are a fan of history and like panoramic views while enjoying a tasty meal, then reserve May 26 on your calendar and plan to join Wing 1 members for a day along the Hudson River.

Three activities are planned, all conveniently within three miles of each other along Route 9.

Locust Grove: We'll start at Locust Grove National Historic Landmark

estate Poughkeepsie, New York. The 200-acre park-like estate includes homes, a carriage house, icehouse, trails, wonderful flower, and vegetable gardens, and it overlooks the Hudson River from a bluff.

The Italianate architecture home belonged to Samuel F. B. Morse, the inventor of the telegraph and Morris Code fame. There is a \$15 charge for the tour.

<u>Shadows on the Hudson</u>: Lunch will be a Shadows on the Hudson. An award-winning waterfront restaurant perched on a cliff 40 feet above the

Hudson River and just 50 feet from its eastern bank. It has truly grand

views of the Mid-Hudson Bridge and Walkway Over the Hudson to the north. The extensive menu will find something for everyone's tastes.

<u>Walkway over the Hudson:</u> Last, is The Walkway over the Hudson State Historic Park is a steel cantilever former railroad bridge spanning the Hudson River between Poughkeepsie on the east bank and Highland on the west bank. The walkway is 237 feet above the Hudson and provides majestic views up and down the Hudson.



BN1 Interior Concours Conformance – Part 1

Before going on to the evaluation of the interior, I want to report on what has been accomplished to correct items discussed in the first article, on the front end. I was not sure that I was going to correct the rivets in the headlight trims. Lynn Martin was kind enough to send me nickel plated rivets, so I made the correction. The first photo shows both the rivet that was chrome plated, on the top ring and the nickel-plated rivet, in the lower ring. The difference is subtle but the correct nickel plating has a warmer color.



The original rivets became chrome plated when the trim rings were plated. They were brass, semi-tubular, rivets that had to be drilled out. The replacement nickel plated rivets are split rivets and are difficult to clinch tightly, to hold the small bracket in place that secures the trim rings to the headlight assembly. So, CA glue was used to assure the bracket and rivet remain secure and tight.

Next the grey piping below the headlights and marker lights has been replaced with the correct black material. I like the look better than the grey.





My replacement mirror did not have the word "eversure" stamped on the mounting clamps and the clamp screw was not the correct "cheese head" screw.





Here both the correct and incorrect mirrors are shown

The instruments were restored by Nisonger Instruments, Mamaroneck, NY.

Their evaluation was my instruments faces were reasonably good, but if they were to be Concours level they would need to have the silk screening redone. The lead time for silk screening, at that time, was nine months. We were early enough into the project that we waited for the new silk screening. I am impressed with the quality of the new gage faces.



Lynn points out a dot on his water temperature gage that is colored yellow, that is shown in the next photo, below the 160 deg mark. I am not about to take my gage apart to add the yellow dot.




The VIN plate on my car is mounted on the left side kick plate. The black background was worn and chipped, so I had it repainted. The VIN numbers are embossed, to produce male numerals that would not be easy to duplicate.





Lynn provided me with this photo of the VIN plate in his car, expressing concern I provided Lynn and Jim this photo from the AHCA Concourse guidelines book.



Not only is this VIN Plate identical to mine, but the number precedes my car (219369) by 22 cars. I think this lends credence to my plate being authentic, but unusual.

The steering wheel on my car was broken.



As you can see, someone actually tried to use a wood screw to mend the break in the wheel rim. This photo shows how we ground the plastic away, so we could weld the spokes back



onto the rim.

We then made a fixture in which we could use the plastic, at the one good spoke intersection, as a pattern to create a mold.



We poured West System G-Flex epoxy, mixed with micro-balloon filler and black pigment, into the mold. The result was then sanded to match the contours.



This is the finished result, after having been painted black, with a single stage urethane automotive paint. The fitting in the hub was to support the wheel during painting. It is satisfying to have saved the original wheel.

The trafficator switch was not functioning. Someone had wired the turn signals into a three-way toggle switch, mounted in a hole drilled in the instrument panel. We had to weld plug around a dozen extra holes that had been added to the instrument panel, over the years. There were eBay ads for repaired trafficator switches in the neighborhood of \$1,100 each. Research led me to Curtis "Curt" Arndt, in Carlsbad, CA, who repairs and restores Austin Healey trafficator switches. Curtis had to replace many missing and broken parts, but he produced a beautiful, working switch assembly, for a little more than half the eBay price.

This photo shows the completed steering wheel/trafficator switch assembly in place.



It is certainly a pleasure having everything back in appearance and function the way it should be.

The upholstery, top, tonneau cover, and side curtains were all made by Heritage Upholstery, in Palm Springs, CA. My first thought, for colors, were to paint the car the same red as my MGTD so they match side by side, with a biscuit interior and top like my MGTD. I also liked the Stayfast cloth top appearance more than the vinyl used on Healeys. Then the Heritage Certificate arrived. The car was originally red, with a red interior and red top. The red body color was already my first choice, so that was easy. Heritage would produce a biscuit interior and Stayfast top, but I chose to go with the original red interior and top. I think the red


interior and top look fantastic, even though they were not my first inclination. Having committed to the idea of being faithful to the original configuration of the car, I chose the original "Karvel" carpet material and the vinyl top and tonneau material. I sent the seats, transmission tunnel and battery box cover to Heritage, paying them to install the upholstery for these items, at the factory. I installed all the rest of the upholstery, supplied in kit form, including most of the hardware necessary for the installation. I have to say that I am pleased with the quality of the materials, fasteners and fit as supplied in the kit. The red of the upholstery compliments the different red of the body color very nicely. Jim wanted to see the seat base and bottoms as shown in these next photos.



The seat bases are painted brown, as are the inside of the instrument panel, transmission tunnel, glove shelf and other metal parts, as I believe they were from the factory.



Lynn points out that the burlap material is not correct as the foam cushion was exposed as it came from the factory. Also, the factory used tacks, not staples, to secure the leather to the base. Here is a photo of Lynn's seat.



I choose to leave my seats as is, for fear of messing up the nice tight fit of the leather as Heritage supplied it.

There is enough detail in the upholstery and interior of the car that I am going to split it into two articles.
